
Investing for Success

This funding will be used to

- Support success and wellbeing for all students as they transition through each stage of learning in an inclusive education system.
- Ensure continuous improvement in the access to, and teaching, learning and assessment of the Australian Curriculum.

Our initiatives include

- Engaging with key stakeholders and community members to provide curriculum strategies that support inclusive learning including Artist in Residence, Sporting Schools initiative, OzHarvest Schools Program and Gifted and Talented clubs.
- Implementing a moderation process, in collaboration with Deep Learning PLC schools as detailed in the P-12 curriculum, assessment and reporting framework.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Resourcing and implementing curriculum programs that support differentiated learning-
 - Artist in Residence (\$8000 resources and wages to support The Arts program)
 - G&T clubs (\$1500 resources and to engage local experts to provide enhanced learning opportunities)
 - OzHarvest School Program (\$800)
- Developing, resourcing and implementing a moderation process (\$1219 Teacher Relief Scheme wages and resources)
